

New Organ Coming to St. Paul's!



The new sanctuary organ will be on its way soon! At a special congregational meeting held on September 10th, the congregation voted overwhelmingly in favor of using funds from Lois Woy's generous bequest for a \$15,000 downpayment on the new organ. We are so very grateful for this outcome.

This organ, which will be called the Lois Woy Memorial Organ, will be built and installed by

Arnold Organs of Barnum, MN. It will use the latest Hauptwerk Technology, which takes digital samples from great pipe organs from around the world. According to the organ builder, the organ should be installed in early 2024!

The members of the organ committee wanted our congregation to have the opportunity to be a part of the purchase of our new instrument. Therefore, we are asking our members to prayerfully consider making a pledge to pay a portion of the remaining balance of \$15,000. Any amount is welcome, and payments in either a lump-sum or installment may be selected. You should have received a letter with a pledge form for the new organ. Simply complete the form at the bottom of the letter, and mail it with a check to St. Paul's, or return it to church and place in the offering plate during a Sunday service. Please write "Organ Fund" on the memo line of your check, so that the check may be properly allocated. We ask that the pledge forms be received by October 29, 2023 and that the donations be received by March 17, 2024. Any donations received after the installation of our new organ will be allocated back to the Lois Woy fund.

We are very appreciative that the congregation also approved drawing from the Lois Woy fund to make up any shortfall in pledges, after the congregation has had the opportunity to donate. We are also thankful that \$3,000 in memorial funds from Louise Lostocco has been made available for the organ purchase.

Our music program is taking a giant step forward, and we so very blessed! *In His Name,*
