

The Food Pantry A Ministry of St. Paul's Lutheran Church

THANK YOU - THANK YOU!! The Food Pantry would like to thank St. Paul's Congregation for their wonderful support over the past summer months. We really appreciate all the food donations and monetary support the Food Pantry is given from our church family.

We are happy to report that the Food Pantry received from Connecticut Food Share a \$1,200.00 grant to be used for any needed equipment. The funds were used for purchasing heavy duty shelving, three shopping carts and various sizes of storage bins. These new items have really helped. The Food Pantry is extremely busy on Wednesdays (delivery day) and on Thursdays (client days).

We are currently averaging 75 clients a week; due to the economy, our numbers have increased.

Connecticut Food Share has provided the pantry with 14,797 pounds of food. Donations from Big Y, Aldi's, Fresh Market, Stop and Shop (2), and Price Rite have given us 34,457 pounds of food. Donations from our church family and friends are not included in this number and we are really grateful for your generosity.

Number wise we have had an increase of 423 clients and the number of people in household is an increase of 2,843 since last year. The food we have received has also increased especially from Connecticut Food Share by 9,197 pounds and with 6 stores donating that has increased by 24,457 pounds.

Our sincere thanks to all the volunteers who give us their free time to help. It's a terrific big job serving, sorting, passing out and driving to pick up food. We could not do it without your help - THANK YOU!!
