



We are hoping to see the natural beauty of flowers grace our Sanctuary more frequently. The hope is that the reduction in cost will allow for members to participate more often.



Finding Grace in Service: My Journey with the Altar Guild by Matt Perry

When I first considered joining the Altar Guild, I was seeking something deeper—a renewed connection to the meaning behind our church services and the sacred symbols we observe each week. I had questions: Why are things arranged the way they are? Why is the service structured in a particular order? What goes into preparing something that, when done well, appears so seamless?

What I discovered was a beautiful blend of tradition, intention, and teamwork.

Joining the Altar Guild gave me the opportunity not only to learn but to serve. I found myself working alongside people I hadn't known well before, and through shared tasks and quiet moments, I began forming meaningful relationships. I was struck by the choreography of the service — the wine poured into cups, the bread broken and shared, the quiet reverence in every detail. It's a collective effort, and it's humbling to be part of it.

That first time I volunteered to set up the altar! I was nervous. What if I misplaced something? What if the bread wasn't where it needed to be? I never needed to fear; the Altar Guild is a team in the truest sense. We support one another, and that sense of community is a gift.

I've come to appreciate the level of detail and planning that goes into every service, from major holidays to quiet Sundays. There's deep consideration for all our members, and I'm proud to be part of a church that strives to make participation in the sacrament accessible to everyone.

One of the most beautiful aspects of the Altar Guild is the distinctive touch each member brings. There's no single "right" way to prepare our altar. As I learned from others, I saw how their individual styles reflected their faith and care. It made me feel more connected — not just to the process, but to our church as a whole.

Now, I look forward to the time I spend preparing the altar. It's become a moment of reflection, a way to center myself and reconnect with God. It clears my mind and brings clarity to my spirit.

Reading scripture during service has also been a transformative experience. The act of reading during service is intimidating at first, but it's also deeply moving. It's an honor to share the Word, and doing so has made me more attentive to how others read. The inflections, the emphasis, the emotion — it's like hearing poetry come to life.

If you've ever considered joining the Altar Guild, I encourage you to take that step. We'd love to welcome you, share our experiences, and learn from yours. There's room for everyone, and every contribution adds something special to our shared worship.




